Consider extension of Depository Contract with Prosperity Bank, and take any necessary action

It was noted that the extension would be for a total of two years beginning June 1, 2013.

A motion was made by Comm. Deyton, seconded by Comm. Beliek to extend the Depository Contract with Prosperity Bank for an additional two years. Motion carried.

Presentation of annual Racial Profiling Report from Sheriff's Office, and take any necessary action

Andy Louderback, Sheriff, provided the Court with a copy of the Racial Profile Report, and noted some of the changes from 2011 to 2012. The report was received by the Court. Clerk's note: A copy of report on file among exhibits of Commissioners' Court.

Consider acceptance of FY 2013 Local Border Security Program Grant including approval of payment of overtime, and take any necessary action

Judge Simons noted that the grant amount was \$45,000.00.

A motion was made by Judge Simons, seconded by Comm. Hunt to accept the grant and to approve the payment of overtime hours for employees working on state grant. Project overtime, for the purposes of this grant, is defined as the time an employee on a twenty-eight (28) day cycle works on this project beyond one-hundred-sixty (160) hours of regular duty in the same time period. For employees on a seven-day (7) cycle, Project overtime is defined as the time an employee works on this project beyond forty (40) hours of regular duty in the same time period. Paid leave shall be considered regular duty, though cannot work the program on the same day sick time is taken. Motion carried.
