WHEREAS, the county road system will be eligible for assistance from this funding;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commissioners Court of Jackson County does hereby support the Proposition One constitutional amendment for the state highway fund to be considered on November 4, 2014, and requests its approval by the voters.
